Summary of Data Assessment Prior to Visit:

Establishment M0000 is a very small slaughter and processing establishment that slaughters porcine approximately two days per week on one shift. The establishment also slaughters livestock under a custom exemption. The establishment commenced federal operations on March 1, 2023, and this was the initial DVMS Humane Handling new grant visit. The Public Health Information System (PHIS) data concerning verification of the livestock humane handling task was reviewed for the period March 1, 2023, through March 31, 2023. There were no noncompliance records (NR) and no memorandum of interview (MOI) associated with livestock humane handling documented during that time period. No enforcement actions for egregious humane handling noncompliance had been implemented.

Systematic Approach Comments:

The establishment does not have a Systematic Approach to Humane Handling of Livestock for Slaughter as defined by the Federal Register Notice Federal Volume 69, No. 174, Thursday, September 9th, 2004[Docket No. 04-013N]; Humane Handling and Slaughter and the Merits of a Systematic Approach to Meet Such Requirements.

Summary of Reason(s) for Recommendation:

The purpose of the new grant visit was to discuss the federal Humane Handling regulations and provide information on humane handling of livestock. At the time of this visit the establishment was in compliance with the applicable parts of the Humane Handling regulations (9 CFR 313).

board and hand-held electric prod. Severe on hogs were observed during truck inspection. The hogs were unloaded using a portable ramp, constructed of a white lorizontal cleats. The hogs did skid as they walked down the ramp and a couple

hogs lost footing when the solution is slid off the slide of the ramp. The hogs were moved through a ninety-degree lefthand turn and into the portable hogo estrainer without incident. The hogs were stunned using electricity in a twostep head/thorax procedure. We talked about having a back-up device readily available. All hogs observed were stunned effectively on the initial stun attempt and remained in a state of surgical anesthesia though shackling, sticking and bleeding.
